Her trajectory took a transformative turn in her association with National Rural Livelohood Mission (NRLM), leading her to participate her first training on a food processing training at Mawlai Umshiang Organize by Science and Technology in the year of 2020 also she participates a training at IHM Shillong in 2024. She was secure a Bank Linkage loan of 2,50,000/- to establish her own Juice Processing Micro Enterprise in the year 2024. Initially, she invested 50,000/- from herself for machinery and setup. She had also participated in the Pineapple festival 2024 at Delhi Haat, New Delhi.

Badashisha Dkhar have setup her own Juice Processing Micro Enterprise – at Umpleng, Cement Market. Currently, she have three people working at her Processing Unit.

At present she is earning 1,80,000/- per annum conclusively from her Juice Processing Enterprise.

With the assistance of NRLM, she secured a loan of Rs. 40,000 from her SHG, enabling her to invest in her business infrastructure.

Additionally, Angieloreta capitalized on government schemes like the Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) scheme, facilitated by the Directorate of Food Processing and NRLM. Leveraging these opportunities, she acquired machinery, tools, and equipment essential for enhancing her food processing operations.

Her once modest venture flourished, leading to a substantial increase in her annual income, which surpassed Rs. 100,000. 3. Note on lakhpati didi's transformation journey:

Ms.Suklin Dohling,a 31 years old women was a small scale farmer struggling to make ends meet. She grew millets, fruits, vegetables but wanted to diversify her income streams. Ms,Suklin attended a training program on food processing and entrepreneurship, organize by a local NGO.she learn to process millets,fruit,and vegetables into various product. Ms,Suklin Dohling initially earned Rs.50,000 annually. Her life took a significant turn when she became a founding member of the Tiewlyngksiar SHG 2018.Joining the SHG opened doors to various interventions facilitated by NRLM. During her journey with NRLM Laitkroh BMMU she can access support of Loan from VO Rs.50000 and extend her activity. Training sessions on processing, packaging and labelling further enhanced her ability to showcase her products effectively in the market. With these newfound skills and resources, Ms. Suklin annual income surged to Rs. 100,000. Suklin success demonstrates the potential of women led to agriculture entrepreneurship in rural areas. Her processing unit created a sustainable income source, improved her livelihood, and inspire others to follow her lead.

4. Challenges and issues.

Mrs, Suklin Dohling has encountered challenges, particularly with planting finger millet due to heavy rainfall and pests affecting her crops more severely than usual.

With the steadfast support of the Meghalaya State Rural Livelihoods Society (MSRLS), Rajmita received invaluable skills development training, which equipped her with the necessary tools to thrive in her chosen craft. As a result, she honed her skills in handloom weaving, a traditional craft deeply rooted in her community's heritage.

In a commendable display of dedication and entrepreneurial spirit, Rajmita utilized the six handlooms provided by MSRLS, in convergence with the Community Service Centre for Crafts (CSCC), to produce a diverse range of clothing items. These include shawls, dakmandas, (Garo Dress) gana plain, gamchas, cousin covers, door mats, and more.

Through her diligent efforts and the quality of her craftsmanship, Rajmita has successfully established a thriving business. She sells her handwoven products in the local market, where they are highly sought after by customers. As a result, Rajmita's monthly earnings range from approximately Rs. 16,000/- to Rs. 18,000/-, amounting to an impressive annual income of Rs. 184,000/-.

With her newfound financial independence, Rajmita now manages her household expenses autonomously, exemplifying the transformative power of sustainable livelihood initiatives. Her success story serves as an inspiration to others in her community, demonstrating the potential for economic empowerment and self-reliance through skill development and entrepreneurship.

3. SHORT NOTE ON LAKHPATI DIDI'S TRANSFORMATION JOURNEY:-

Mrs. Majestiful started her journey of tailoring since the early 1998, previously she have earn her living in tailoring, sewing clothes when the customer gives them clothes only, so it goes on like this, later she's taking loans from MIDC with an amount of ₹ 73,000 for the purpose of enhancing her small business on buying clothes which the customer need and according to the trends required in that generation, she has repaid all her loans on this amount. During this year she have earn an estimated income of ₹40,000- ₹ 50,000 per annum.

Later, Mrs. Majestiful have entered into NRLM in the year 2021 under the SHG name *"Kyntulang SHG"*. In the year 2023 she have taken loans from her SHG group with an amount of ₹ 1,00,000 for the purpose of buying more fabrics and other equipment required in her business and this loans have been repaid 82% from the loan amount and the interest amount have been cleared. She also give training to rural youth who are interested in tailoring and from here also she have earn some income per students. She started to sell what she have produce like market bag, readymade jainsem, embroidery (Shrong) and other finish products. After entering into NRLM she have made an estimated net income of ₹1.56 lakhs per annum since she have been recognise by many customer and recommended by her group members.

Mrs. Majestiful have received training from USHA SILAI giving since the 1st phase of training till date. She gain more knowledge in finishing her products needly and finely. She is one of the active members of USHA SILAI TCPC.

4. CHALLENGES AND ISSUES:-

Besides her hard work till date, she still have few challenges like:-

- Difficulties in managing the requirement of the shop and
- Marketing of the products.

3. SHORT NOTE ON LAKHPATI DIDI'S TRANSFORMATION JOURNEY:-

During her days of studies, her aim is to be a Business Women. She have Graduated on Hotel Management from IHM Shillong, after this she pursue her training on Cake specialisation at JVL Academy, Kolkatta. Mrs. Badondor K.Nongrum have started her business in the late 2019, her business deals in Bakery mainly baking a cake and Homestay. She have entered into SHG since the year 2018, and started her business by taking a loan from her SHG with and amount of ₹3,00,000/- as an investment for her business, on bakery and a portion of this loans she have also utilize it for her personal emergency work. From her business on cake making, she earn an amount of ₹4,000/- or more in a month which gives a total annual amount of approximately ₹48,000/-, she have applied an individual seed capital on PMFME and received an amount of ₹ 16,000/- for the purpose of enhancing her bakery business, she have also registered herself in Food Standard Safety and Authority of India fssai. She has now cleared 50% of her loan and still left with another 50% of her loan to be paid.

Besides her business on Bakery, In the year 2023 she has taken another risk by opening her own Homestay named **AI Homestay**, **Pyndengrei**. Her Homestay was recently inaugurated on 1st October 2023 and her first sale was on the 23rd October 2023. Her Homestay contain only two rooms with one attached bathroom, it is a small homestay but the required facility, services and communication is all available. The rent of her guest house is ₹2000/- per day and she have posted her Homestay business online to attract customer. From her homestay she had received an approximate net income of ₹ 60,000/- till date, with the income received from her homestay she used to repay her loan.

On starting this homestay business, she had also applied for Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) scheme for construction of her Homestay at Pyndengrei, with an amount of \gtrless 8,65,725/-, getting a subsidy of 30% from the total amount of loan, have to pay an EMI of 2% from the total amount of loan and One time payment on security deposit @5% before the money was sanction, she has made a regular payment on this also. She has also work as MIS cadres as part-time job, under Nongstoin BMMU, she works hard in every work assign to her she and she's very active. Her annual Income range between Rs. 1 lakh to 1.2 Lakh Annually.

4. IMPACT/ OUTCOME:-

The impact/Outcome of her business is that

- She is able to make used of her own profession.
- She have more knowledge on both of her business/Carrier.(*ie cake making and Homestay*)
- She earn her living by using her own profession and skills.

Mrs. Jesilia A Sangma, a resident of Boldamgre village, South West Garo Hills, Meghalaya, has earned herself the title of "Lakhpati Didi". Before joining in the SHGs she was a housewife and look after the family with regular housework. She became a member of A. kimbri SHGs of her village on 16th January, 2018. Since joining in SHGs she has been obtained various training on skill development and marketing strategy, 8th month after joining in the SHGs, through DAY-NRLM she has been provided working capacital of Rs. 20000 from the VO CIF fund as initial support. Mrs Jesilia A. Sangma has engaged herself in Food Processing(Pickle, jam,squash, candy, juice, fruits wie etc) and selling her value addition products in local market, food exhibition etc and additionally, she has been obtained Rs. 100000 from the Prime Hub. With this capital, she has been expanded her business and through her business she started earning Rs.20000 to Rs. 30000 per month.

Mrs Jesilia A. Sangma has transformed herself into a successful entrepreneur and earned herself the title of "Lakhpati Didi" under the guidance and hand holding support of DAY-NRLM. Moreover, Jesilia A. Sangma has not only become successful but also emerged as an inspiration for women in the South West Garo Hills.



3. Short Note on Lakhpati Didi's Transformation Journey:

Mrs. Kyntiewlin Nongsiej from Mawranglang Village of Shilajong an aspiring individual who wanted to do something more than serving as a school teacher found her interest in pickle making through producing pickles for household consumption, she started manufacturing pickles for her friends and relatives as a part time hobby after her teaching duties. It was only after receiving trainings through various institutions such as DCIC, RRTC that she started taking her talents and interests seriously, she started her manufacturing "M/s Shilajong Manufacturer" in the year 2018 whereby she started making pickles of various local fruits and started selling them at the village level, distributing to various tea stalls and within Mawkyrwat Market.

Since then Ms. Kyntiewlin Nongsiej has undergone various trainings through KVIC, NRLM, DCIC, IHM and other institutions and is also one of the Master Trainers at various Block level Food Processing Trainings conducted by the BMMU and is also encouraging others to take up the activity. Ms. Kyntiewlin is currently earning a monthly income of Rs. 30,000/- to Rs. 40,000/- monthly through her teaching job and her activity of Food Processing. She is also a beneficiary of the Mini Food and Fruit Processing Unit through MSRLS & MBDA and one of the beneficiaries of PRIME receiving a soft loan of Rs. 3,00,000/- for further upgradation of her pickle making business.

2. Short note on Lakhpati Didi Transformation Journey

Baiahunlang Sankli is both an entrepreneur and a school teacher. She began her bakery journey in 2021 and continues to excel in her business.

Baiahunlang's journey took off when she decided to join the Lawei Ba Phyrnai SHG under VO - Natyllong. With a longstanding interest in baking, she underwent training in food processing and bakery at the Don Bosco Training Centre. Due to her passion for baking, she chose to focus on it as an alternative source of income. She started by making cakes and cookies at home in a very small space and eventually opened a bakery shop in her village. She has received various forms of financial assistance, including Rs. 140,000 from PMEGP for Oven, Refrigerator, solar energy and an inverter, Rs. 25,000 from PMFME, and Rs. 10,000 from her SHG group. Her annual sales exceed Rs. 200,000.

In conclusion, Baiahunlang Sankli has greatly benefited from financial assistance and other support through NRLM, and she encourages other women to join the NRLM fold.
